1. <u>The Principal's Report</u> - Highlights the key activities, events, and successes of the past year and briefly describes major new initiatives to be undertaken over the next year.

Govt. Maharani Laxmibai, P.G. Girls College is a Govt. funded college affiliated to D.A.V.V. Indore. It offers a wide range of under graduate & post graduate programmes. At under graduate Level **14** programmes are offered (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com, B.B.A., Library Science and B.Sc. Home Science). **15** programmes are offered at Post graduate Level (M.A. Hindi, English, Political Science, History, Sociology, Economics, Psychology, Instrumental Music, Drawing & Painting and Dance), M.Sc. (Chemistry and Bio-chemistry), M.Sc. Home Science (Food & Nutrition, Textiles & Clothing) and M. com . The Institute is research centre for 08 Subjects. **20** Faculty Member are register guide. In the Current year **08** students have being awarded Ph.d Degree.

At under graduate Level unified syllabus, designed by the Department of Higher Education, Bhopal is followed. For Post-graduate programmes, syllabus is prescribed by the university. The institution has a limited flexibility to form the syllabus. Professors of the college are senior having more than 30 years of teaching experience. They hold positions such as Dean, chairpersons and members of Board of studies of the university play a vital role in the development of curriculum for the Post-graduate, M.Phil. and Ph.D. entrance exams. The institute offers academic flexibility to the students by providing a variety of subject combinations at U.G. level.

The institution follows a academic calendar, issued by the Department of Higher Education MP. At the beginning of the session, Principal holds the staff council meeting, in which the entire chalked out plan is discussed and conveyed to the staff for the effective implementation of the curriculum. The teachers strictly follow the time-table prepared by the college. The institute extends its full support by providing all the facilities like separate departments, computers, ICT facility, internet and departmental library to improve teaching and Learning practices.

The new NEP 2020 places great emphasis on integrated and interdisciplinary education. The union cabinet of India approved that National Education Policy (NEP) on July 28 th 2020. The policy gives emphasis on the study of the humanities language, arts, dance, music, and more along with the study of Science, Commerce, Home-Science and Arts. The campus of college spreads over 13 acres with a built-up area of 7568.23 sq. meters. The institution is affiliated to Devi Ahilya University, Indore and is recognized by UGC under section 2(f) and 12(b).

(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

Govt. Maharani Laxmibai P.G. Girls College, earlier known as Govt New Girls College was established in 1965 (shifted from a school where it was founded in 1963) within a fort which was constructed by the Holkar State in 1860. It is situated in urban location.

There has been a constant increase in the admission graph of students. The college began with a modest number of 28 students and at the time of accreditation by NAAC in 2004 it had reached up to 1750. At present the strength of college is 5284. The college has been imparting education to the girls in six streams viz Arts, Science, Commerce, Home Science, Business Administration and Library Science. The Departments of Commerce, Biochemistry, Bio-technology, Library Science, Computer Science and Business Administration are run under self-financing scheme. The college has 25 Departments with a total strength of 73 faculty members, out of which 48 are regular and 25 are temporary teachers. The non-teaching staff comprises of 39 employees.



5. <u>The Student Experience</u>

Briefly describes student life in the college:

Infrastructural facilities available to students - Classrooms, Smart classrooms, laboratories and equipment, Common Research Lab, Hostel; Canteen; Garden; Students common room, Auditorium, Sports Complex & other facilities like, construction of ramps, railings and toilets are made available by the institution to meet the requirements of the students with physical disabilities. For the physically disabled classes are held on the ground floor. The residential facility and various provisions available within the institute are as follows:

- **Hostel Facility** The institute has a hostel. It has 27 residential rooms for the accommodation of 70 students. Each room has bed, table, chair, fan and wardrobe. There is a dining hall; Mess facility is available to the students.
- **Recreational facilities** Gym is available in the college premises for the students of hostel along with carom-board and Chess. An LCD is also installed for the recreation and education.
- **Computer facilities** Computer facility is also provided to the residents of hostel.
- **Library** students can make use of the books available in the hostel library, To upgrade their knowledge.
- **Security** Three security guards have been appointed by the institute. One securityguard is for the day shift, one for the night shift, and one security-guard, for the hostel.
- An indoor hall which serves as a make shift auditorium and an open stage are available in the college premises for educational and recreational purpose. Sports room also has the facility of providing games like carom-board and chess for recreation.
- A **common staff room** is also available for the facility of the staff.
- A Girls' common room is also available for the facility of the students.
- One **staff quarter** is there in the premises of the college.

• Academic Initiatives

The teachers use various teaching methods to make the teaching-learning process effective. Academically weak students are provided help through notes and extra lectures. Students are encouraged to undertake projects, internship and field visits, which help in better comprehension and give them an opportunity to have a deeper and more practical knowledge about the subject. The highly qualified and competent teachers constantly strive for individual excellence and keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in their fields by attending national and international seminars, workshops and training courses.

A good infrastructure has been provided to all the departments which include wellestablished libraries and laboratories, projectors, computers with web access to make learning more students centric. The institution regularly organizes various curricular and cocurricular activities to nurture critical thinking, creativity and scientific temper amongst students. Eminent scholars are invited here to deliver lectures on a various of topics, share their knowledge and experience with the students and teachers.

The principal also holds meetings with the alumni, stake-holders and students of the institute, inviting suggestions for the improvement. Staff council meeting are held to discuss significant issues like admission, student union election, examination etc.

The Heads of the departments are given the freedom and flexibility to take decisions in the interest of the students and the institution. A variety of welfare schemes like GIS, GPF, Medical leave and maternity leave are made available to the teaching and non-teaching staff. The institution makes sure the grievances/complaints are promptly attended to and resolved effectively by concerned committees.

Class III and IV employers' recruitment and grievances and decisions regarding official and financial matters are made in meetings with the office staff, supervised by the Principal.

By the end of the session all the proposed and implemented plans are evaluated and reviewed by the Principal and the members of IQAC.

The institute also receives additional fund through self-finance courses, which are used for its development and the disbursement of salary to the teachers working under such courses. The accounts of the institute are audited by internal and external auditors.

Student Support

The record of student's progression in the academic year 2020-21 has been quite remarkable. The detailed information regarding criteria for admission, courses offered, eligibility, fee structure etc. Can be found on the college website. As most of the students belong of the economically weaker section of society (SC, ST, OBC, Physically handicapped), they get financial assistance under various scholarships schemes. Meritorious students are also given financial help under the Pratibha Kiran Yojna'.

Students enrolled in N.S.S., N.C.C. and athletes are given the opportunity of appearing in practical and internal exams outside the scheduled time-table. Athletically accomplished students are also given incentives in the form of sports kits, certificates, cash rewards and other tokens.

The Career Guidance / Placement Cell work organizes regular workshops, seminars and career fair to familiarize students with job prospects in various fields. Renowned scholars and experts are also invited to deliver lectures and enlighten students, especially about proper communication skills, spoken English and overall personality development. Despite their conservative backgrounds, many girls avail job opportunities like running their boutiques, coaching classes, serving in schools as, teachers and working as dietitians in well-known hospitals. departments like Commerce, Computer Science, Psychology, English, Home Science, Mathematics, Drawing & Painting and Dance encourage the students to be self- dependent and develop their entrepreneurial skills. Activity clubs, on the other hand, help in grooming their personality.

Events & Intiatives

The institute dedicates special attention to the effective implementation of curricular and co-curricular activities. The teaching staff made sure to adhere to the academic calendar issued by the Dept of higher Education.

Each department formed an activity club to Organize various activates like group discussion, paper presentation, impromptu story writing competition, quiz and talent search programmers. The students displayed their creativity and imagination with the help of power point presentation.

Students enrolled in the NSS, Participated and volunteered their services in various camps organized at different places. NSS students held a Camp for cleanliness and sold articles created by usually impaired and mentally challenged children to assist them financial. Guest lecturers were also organized to familiarize students with Parliamentary procedure.Besides students also participated in various University & State level sports competitions and won several accolades. They also participated in Dance, Music and Art competitions in the youth festival.
