1. The Principal's Report - Highlights the key activities, events, and successes of the past year and briefly describes major new initiatives to be undertaken over the next year.

Govt. Maharani Laxmibai, P.G. Girls College is a Govt. funded college affiliated to D.A.V.V. Indore. It offers a wide range of under graduate & post graduate programmes. At under graduate Level **14** programmes are offered (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com, B.B.A., Library Science and B.Sc. Home Science). **15** programmes are offered at Post graduate Level (M.A. Hindi, English, Political Science, History, Sociology, Economics, Psychology, Instrumental Music, Drawing & Painting and Dance), M.Sc. (Chemistry and Bio-chemistry), M.Sc. Home Science (Food & Nutrition, Textiles & Clothing) and M. com . The Institute is research centre for 08 Subjects. **20** Faculty Member are register guide. In the Current year **08** students have being awarded Ph.d Degree.

At under graduate Level unified syllabus, designed by the Department of Higher Education, Bhopal is followed. For Post-graduate programmes , syllabus is prescribed by the university. The institution has a limited flexibility to form the syllabus. Professors of the college are senior having more than 30 years of teaching experience. They hold positions such as Dean, chairpersons and members of Board of studies of the university play a vital role in the development of curriculum for the Post-graduate, M.Phil. and Ph.D. entrance exams. The institute offers academic flexibility to the students by providing a variety of subject combinations at U.G. level.

The institution follows a academic calendar, issued by the Department of Higher Education MP. At the beginning of the session, Principal holds the staff council meeting, in which the entire chalked out plan is discussed and conveyed to the staff for the effective implementation of the curriculum. The teachers strictly follow the time-table prepared by the college. The institute extends its full support by providing all the facilities like separate departments, computers, ICT facility, internet and departmental library to improve teaching and Learning practices.

The new NEP 2020 places great emphasis on integrated and interdisciplinary education. The union cabinet of India approved that National Education Policy (NEP) on July 28th 2020. The policy gives emphasis on the study of the humanities language, arts, dance, music, and more along with the study of Science, Commerce, Home-Science and Arts. Integrating art and design with stem increases the happiness and well being of students. Through the multidisciplinary approach a student's gains a no of skills- problem solving critical thinking, time management, self management, Communication and writing, team work and much more that are easily transferable across work environments. Govt. Maharani Laxmibai P.G. Girls College earlier known as Govt. New Girls College was established in 1965 (shifted from a school where it was founded in 1963) within a fort which was constructed by the Holkar State in 1860. It is situated in urban location. The campus of college spreads over 13 acres with a built-up area of 7568.23 sq. meters. The institution is affiliated to Devi Ahilya University, Indore and is recognized by UGC under section 2(f) and 12(b).

(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

Govt. Maharani Laxmibai P.G. Girls College, earlier known as Govt New Girls College was established in 1965 (shifted from a school where it was founded in 1963) within a fort which was constructed by the Holkar State in 1860. It is situated in urban location.

There has been a constant increase in the admission graph of students. The college began with a modest number of 28 students and at the time of accreditation by NAAC in 2004 it had reached up to 1750. At present the strength of college is 5284. The college has been imparting education to the girls in six streams viz Arts, Science, Commerce, Home Science, Business Administration and Library Science. The Departments of Commerce, Bio-chemistry, Bio-technology, Library Science, Computer Science and Business Administration are run under self-financing scheme. The college has 25 Departments with a total strength of 73 faculty members, out of which 48 are regular and 25 are temporary teachers. The non-teaching staff comprises of 39 employees.

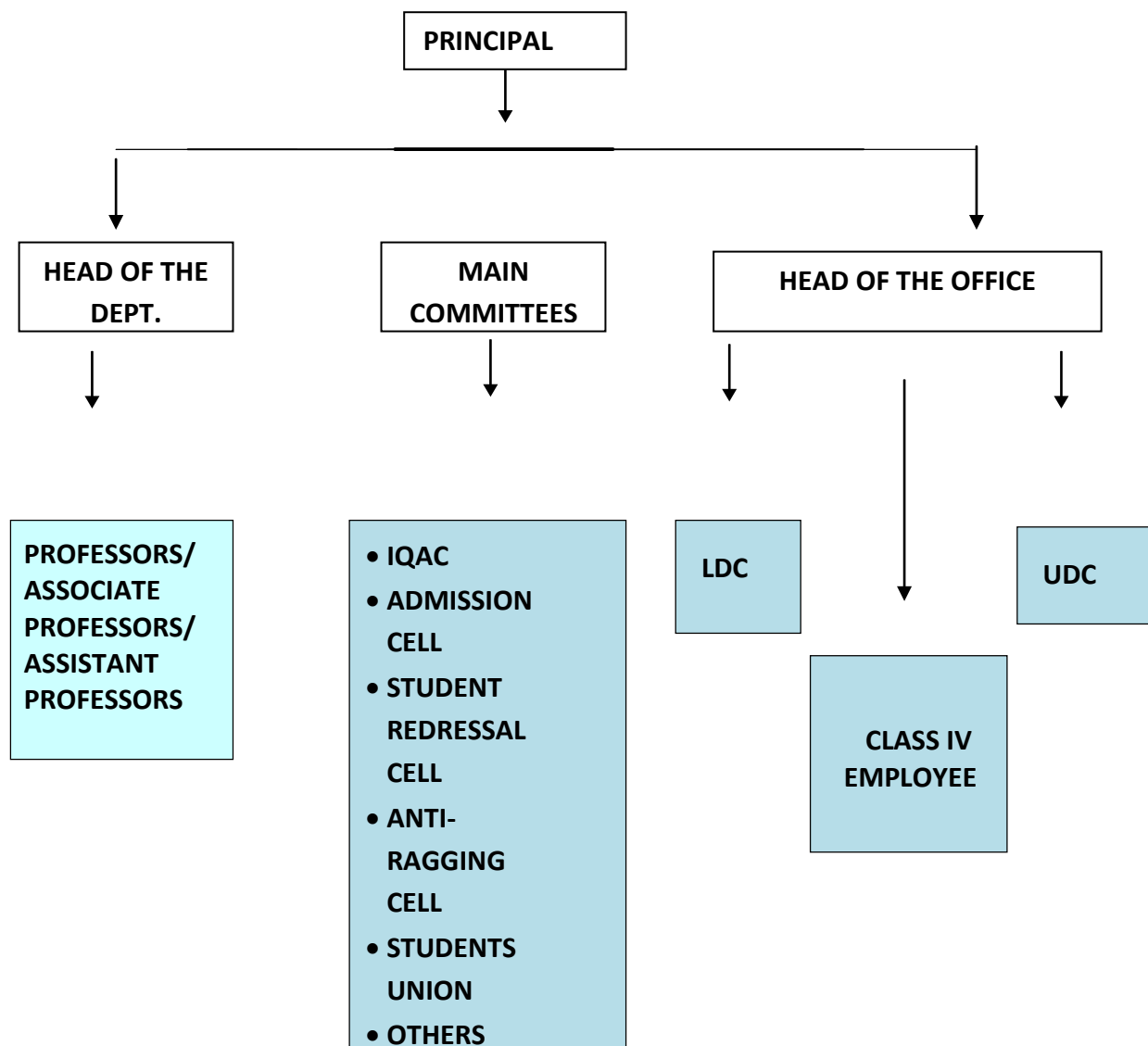

5. The Student Experience

Briefly describes student life in the college:

Infrastructural facilities available to students - Classrooms, Smart classrooms, laboratories and equipment, Common Research Lab, Hostel; Canteen; Garden; Students common room, Auditorium, Sports Complex & other facilities like, construction of ramps, railings and toilets are made available by the institution to meet the requirements of the students with physical disabilities. For the physically disabled classes are held on the ground floor. The residential facility and various provisions available within the institute are as follows:

- **Hostel Facility**– The institute has a hostel. It has 27 residential rooms for the accommodation of 70 students. Each room has bed, table, chair, fan and wardrobe. There is a dining hall; Mess facility is available to the students.
- **Recreational facilities**– Gym is available in the college premises for the students of hostel along with carom-board and Chess. An LCD is also installed for the recreation and education.
- **Computer facilities** – Computer facility is also provided to the residents of hostel.
- **Library**- students can make use of the books available in the hostel library, To upgrade their knowledge.
- **Security**– Three security guards have been appointed by the institute. One security-guard is for the day shift, one for the night shift, and one security-guard, for the hostel.
- **An indoor hall** which serves as a make shift auditorium and an **open stage** are available in the college premises for educational and recreational purpose. **Sports room** also has the facility of providing games like carom-board and chess for recreation.
- A **common staff room** is also available for the facility of the staff.
- A **Girls' common room** is also available for the facility of the students.
- One **staff quarter** is there in the premises of the college.
- The college has constant supply of safe drinking water with the advanced facility of RO and aqua guard.

Annual improvement in academic, research & administrative Initiatives

- **Academic Initiatives**

The institution strives to cater to the educational requirements of students of all categories. It adopts pragmatic approaches to achieve academic excellence. Admissions are made strictly according to the norms of Higher education assuring complete transparency in the admission process. The institution adheres to the reservation policy for ST/ST/OBC and differently able students. Advertisement for admissions is done through the college prospectus and the college website <http://mlbgpgindore.com> the constant increase in the strength of students is a testament to the success of institute.

The teachers use various teaching methods to make the teaching-learning process effective. Academically weak students are provided help through notes and extra lectures. Students are encouraged to undertake projects, internship and field visits, which help in better comprehension and give them an opportunity to have a deeper and more practical knowledge about the subject. The highly qualified and competent teachers constantly strive for individual excellence and keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in their fields by attending national and international seminars, workshops and training courses.

A good infrastructure has been provided to all the departments which include well-established libraries and laboratories, projectors, computers with web access to make learning more students centric. The institution regularly organizes various curricular and co-curricular activities to nurture critical thinking, creativity and scientific temper amongst students. Eminent scholars are invited here to deliver lectures on a various of topics, share their knowledge and experience with the students and teachers.

Literary clubs, exhibitions, and a various cultural and sports programmes provide students a platform to show case their talents. Student's academic capabilities are assessed through regular CCEs, group discussions, assignments, surprise tests and university exams. The institute also makes an effort to receive students feed-back on faculty performance.

- **Research Initiatives**

The institute employs well qualified faculty members most of them with more than thirty years of experience. There are **49** regular professors, out of which **40** professors have Ph.D. degree. There are **25** guest faculties, out of which **18** have a doctoral degree, **03** have cleared NET and **02** have done SLET. **20** faculty members are registered guide. The Institute is a Centre for research in **08** subjects: Chemistry, Drawing& Painting, Dance, English, Home science and Psychology, Hindi & Economic. Duty leave and study leave are provided to teachers as an Incentives to facilitate research.

The Institute has a huge of a main library, along with a library dedicated to each department to be used by teachers and students for research. The laboratories also lend themselves to research work by the faculty and the students.

In the year 2021-22, **07** students have been awarded Ph.D. degree and **28** papers have been published in National and international journals of repute. **153** seminars, **95** workshops, **23** Faculty Development Programmers and **09** Short Terms Courses have been attended by the faculty, ensuring that they were making the most of the lock- down during the covid-19 pandemic.

- **Administrative Initiatives**

The Principal of the institution appoints an administrative officer responsible for looking after administrative tasks. The IQAC is formed at the beginning of every session to plan the quality enhancement and progress of the institution. Many committees are also created under the principal's guidance to execute the IQAC's plan.
